Make a note—A Live Music Note for Boalsburg's Plans for a Colorful Columbus Weekend in October

Historic Boalsburg village will celebrate its unique connection with Christopher Columbus with a colorful multicultural festival during the day and a fancy ball in the evening of October 6, 2007, the Saturday before the nation's Columbus Day,

Boalsburg is home to the Columbus Chapel, the most significant link with Christopher Columbus in North America. Boal family descendants of Columbus inherited and imported the Spanish Chapel to America in 1909. It contains the admiral's desk used by the world-famous explorer and centuries-old European art and religious objects.

From Noon to 4 PM at the historic Boalsburg village square, the public can sample the food, music and crafts of the many cultures which have shaped America at the Boalsburg Multicultural Columbus Festival. Free wagon rides will provide a guided tour of historic Boalsburg village and of the nearby Boal Mansion, site of the Columbus Chapel.

At 7:30 PM, guests will gather at the Boal Mansion Museum for the annual Boalsburg Columbus Ball with champagne and fine hors d'oeuvres, contra-dancing, and speaking appearances in period dress by Columbus and the pioneer Captain David Boal.
